## Spring 2008 Course Registration

The Spring 2008 Schedule of Courses is now available for viewing on the College of Law's website at [http://www.law.ufl.edu/students/course\\_schedules.shtml](http://www.law.ufl.edu/students/course_schedules.shtml). Please keep in mind that although the schedule has been set, it is subject to change. You should view the schedule again immediately prior to advanced registration to check for any changes.

Advanced registration for the spring semester is November 19-20. To create a more fair system of registering, we have changed the registration appointment times beginning this semester. Registration start times are as follows:

- all 3L students will begin registering on Nov 19 at 12:00noon, no individual appt times
- all 2L students will begin registering on Nov 20 at 12:00noon, no individual appt times
- all 1L students will be registered automatically by the law school in late November/early December

The Office of the University Registrar has assured us that the system can handle the registration load, however, you may notice a delay in the screens as you advance through the registration process.

**Holds** It is important that you check your ISIS account for any holds and clear them before your registration appointment time or you will not be able to register for courses. The University of Florida has placed holds on all students' records until emergency contact information has been submitted. Please be sure you take time to enter this information before next week to ensure clearing of any holds. UF has sent out emails regarding these holds a few weeks ago, so most of you have already entered this information.

**1st Year Students** The College will register all 1st year students for their 2nd semester courses. 1st year students will be able to view their schedule on ISIS in early-December. **Please be sure you do NOT have any holds on your records so your registration is not delayed.** Delayed registration may result in holding back of financial aid, late registration fees, or late payment fees.

**2nd Year Priority** (*not required*) (Corporations, Evidence, Estates & Trusts) Second year students who wish to enroll in registration priority courses are responsible for registering themselves on Nov 20 at noon. These courses will not be open for 3Ls until Nov 21.

**Legal Drafting** (*required*) All students must take Legal Drafting in their 2<sup>nd</sup> year of law school. Legal Drafting is offered in both Fall and Spring. Students have been assigned a semester in which they must take Legal Drafting according to their first year Section assignment. **It is the student's responsibility to register for a Legal Drafting section for the appropriate semester as designated below.**

- Students from sections 3 and 4 must take Legal Drafting in the Spring 2008 semester.
- Students in sections 1 and 2 are taking currently registered for Legal Drafting this Fall 2007.

Any section 3 or 4 student who does not register for a section of Legal Drafting will be administratively added into any open spot in any available section during the drop/add period of that term. If the only available opening conflicts with another course on the student's schedule, the student will be dropped from the conflicting course and Legal Drafting will be added. *There are no exceptions to this policy.*

**Seminars** One of the graduation requirements of the Levin College of Law is the completion of a seminar or advanced course. If you plan to graduate in Spring 2008 and have not yet satisfied this requirement, you should make sure that you preregister for a seminar. If you fail to preregister, you may not be able to graduate if there are no openings in these offerings at a later time. **To ensure that there are sufficient seminar seats for graduating seniors, students will be able to preregister for only one seminar during the advanced registration period of Nov 19-20.** After Nov 20, students will be able to register for multiple seminars.
